VIRTUAL Symposium „Management of Urinary Tract Infections in the Practice: How to achieve the best use of evidence?”



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Uncomplicated urinary tract infections (uUTI) are responsible for a high proportion of antibiotic prescriptions in primary care. In general, the development of treatment approaches to reduce the consumption of antibiotics represents a global challenge. For uUTI, different approaches to reduce antibiotic consumption have been tested in randomized controlled trials. The meta-analytical evaluation of these studies represents a promising approach to compare these strategies and to identify predictors of non-antibiotic therapy success. The symposium “Management of UTI in clinical practice: How to achieve the best use of evidence?” will present and discuss methodological peculiarities and challenges as well as new findings in diagnostics and therapy.
