Course outline: We will introduce methods to perform a systematic review and meta-analysis in health research. The workshop will cover how to formulate a research question, define inclusion and exclusion criteria, search for the evidence, extract and organize data, and perform a meta-analysis. A special focus will be on the analysis of diagnostic accuracy and data from randomized controlled trials. This is a practical skills course, with short lessons and small group activities, addressed to early or mid-career health researchers, as well as to doctoral students, interested in strengthening their methodological skills in Systematic Reviews and Meta-analysis.
